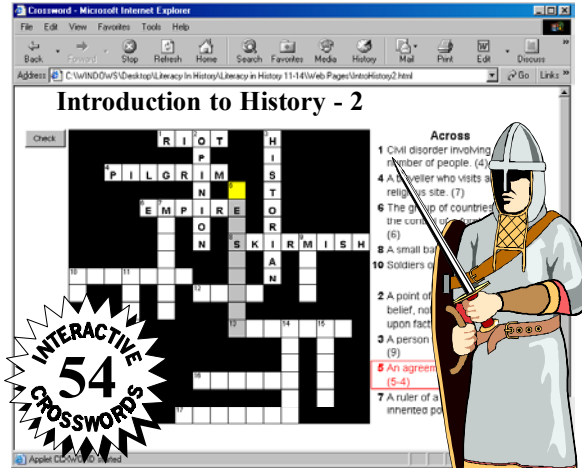




# LITERACY IN HISTORY (11-14)

- The people who lived in the British Isles before the Romans invaded. (5)
- The last Anglo-Saxon King of England. In 1066, he defeated his brother, Tostig and Harold Godwinson at Stamford Bridge, but was defeated by William the Conqueror shortly afterwards. (c.1022-66) (6,9)
- A survey of all England in 1086. It listed place names, property and numbers of people and soldiers. (8,4)
- A picture woven into fabric. (8)
- People originating from Normandy in France, led by William. (7)

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### Literacy in History (11-14) The French Revolution - 2

2 The assembly set up on 19th June 1789 by representatives of the third Estate, some radical nobles and clergy, in frustration at the Estates-General. It had a single chamber. (8,8)

4 The attempted escape of King Louis and his family. They were seen and captured at Varennes, and taken back to Paris. (6,2,8)

5 A meeting of representatives of the three Estates, called in 1788. (7-7)

7 A country not ruled by a monarch. (8)

10 A written document detailing the rights and responsibilities of citizens. (12)

12 A turning point in the Revolution in 1789, when the National Assembly (illegal at the time) was locked outside the palace at Versailles. They took an oath on the Royal Tennis court, not to leave until the King granted them the National Assembly. (6,5,4)

13 The taking over of a hated prison in 14 July 1789 which was of great significance, even though only 7 prisoners were inside at the time. Weapons were also stolen. (8,2,3,8)

**Down**

1 The French general who crowned himself Emperor in 1804. His forces were defeated by Nelson at the battle of Trafalgar and by the Duke of Wellington at Waterloo. (1769-1821) (8,9)

3 The new name of the National Assembly after September 1792, when every member was replaced. It was in this month that France was declared a Republic. (8,10)

4 Friendliness and openness to others. (10)

6 The famous revolutionary song that is still the French National Anthem today. (12)

8 A device for execution by beheading, using a heavy blade dropped from a height. (10)

9 The cruel leader of the Convention who oversaw the period called 'The Terror'. He was eventually executed by members of the Convention after bitter power struggles. (1758-94) (11)

11 A violent period between 1793 and 1794 when over 12,000 people were guillotined. (6)

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### Literacy in History (11-14) The Making of the U.K. (1500-1750) - 5

1 A person who supported King Charles I in the English Civil War. (8)

5 The war from 1642 to 1649 between Parliamentarians (Roundheads) and Royalists (Cavaliers) who were supporters of Charles I. The Parliamentarians won and in 1649, Charles I was executed. (7,5,3)

9 The Parliament that agreed to put Charles I on trial. It was so named because they were the MP's left after the army had removed all MP's who might have been on the King's side. (Meaning 'a small remnant') (4)

10 A person in favour of extreme political changes (7)

11 A ruler who has absolute power. (8)

12 The name given to England between 1649 and 1660, when it was governed by Parliament and there was no king. (12)

14 An abusive term for a royalist in the English civil war. (8)

15 A soldier hired to fight for a foreign power. (9)

16 The period of 11 years between monarchs, when Oliver Cromwell was in power (1649-1660). (11)

17 Cromwell's professional army formed in 1644. (3,5,4)

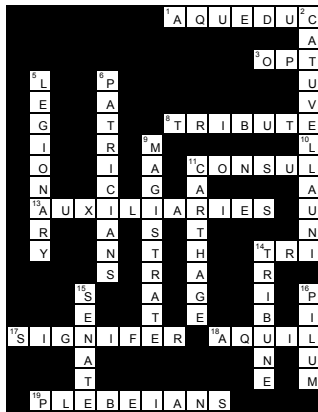

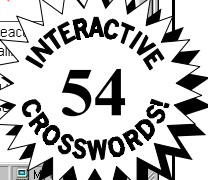

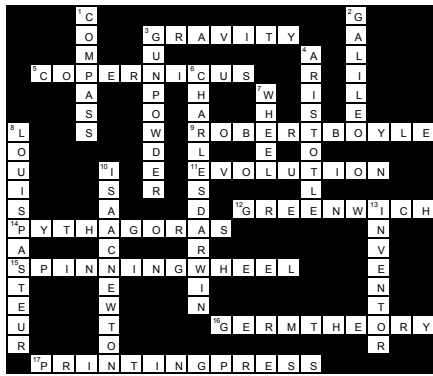
